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## What is Hate Crime?

A hate crime is when a person, or group of people, bullies or hurts someone because they don't like who they are.

The attacker could be any age or anyone – a stranger, a parent, a carer, a friend or a neighbour.



**It Is Wrong!  
See it! Hear it! Report it!**

The attacker can think that the person they are bullying or hurting is different from them because:

- They are disabled
- Of their sexuality (like being gay)
- They have a different colour skin
- Of their religion
- Of their age



Hate Crime can stop someone:

- Feeling safe
- Going out to work
- Going out to college
- Going to pubs
- Going to town



The attacker could:

- Steal
- Hit or push
- Bully
- Call someone names
- Shout at them
- Harass someone
- Write graffiti
- Make rude signs
